# Are you a producer of packaging?



Obligated packaging producers must register and meet their waste packaging recycling responsibilities.

If your business or organisation produces or uses packaging, or sells packaged goods, you may be classed as an obligated packaging producer. Obligated packaging producers must follow rules which help to:

- reduce the amount of packaging produced in the first place
- reduce how much packaging waste goes to landfill
- increase the amount of packaging waste that is recycled

## What counts as packaging?

Packaging is any material that is used to cover or protect goods that are supplied. It makes handling and delivering goods easier and safer. It includes anything that's designed to be filled at the point of sale, such as a coffee cup.

#### What do I need to do?

Firstly, check if the legislation applies to your business and how it applies, the legislation has different requirements for large and small businesses as well as those who hire out or loan reuseable packaging.

If the legislation does apply then every year an obligated packaging producer must:

- register as a packaging producer by 7 April you can do this here: Report packaging data
- meet their recycling obligation
- obtain evidence of compliance
- submit a certificate of compliance (CoC) by 31 January the following year

# What happens if I fail to comply with the regulations?

If you do not comply with the regulations a fine could be issued.
